Program Level - Undergraduate certificate • Program Length - 28 weeks

This program is designed to train students for entry-level employment in residential or commercial construction, remodeling, and/or building maintenance. This unique course blends curriculum prepared by National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER), OSHA and our professional trades instructors.

The program combines classroom and hands-on instruction to prepare students for success in the work environment. The State of Ohio has indicated that job opportunities in construction will be good for those with the appropriate training and skills.

Enrollment Requirements

Students wishing to enroll in the Applied Construction Trades (ACT) program at Mid-East CTC, Adult Education must complete the following enrollment procedures in order to be considered for acceptance into this class:

Application: Students must complete a written Application for Admissions and return it to the Adult Education Office during your interview with the Admissions Coordinator. You may set an appointment with the Admissions Coordinator by calling our office at 740-455-3111 or 1-800-832-7545.

General Assessment: A basic assessment is required to be completed by all students entering a Full-time program. This will be scheduled through the Admissions Office during the interview process.

Financial Aid: Arrangements to have the cost of tuition, books, and supplies paid in full, must be completed to the satisfaction of the Financial Aid Coordinator. Students may apply for Federal Financial Aid in the form of a Pell Grant by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.gov.

Proof of Graduation: A copy of the student's GED Certificate or high school grade transcripts must be submitted to the Admissions Office.

Background Check: You will need to have a BCI Background check (Bureau of Criminal Identification & Investigation) completed. Mid-East CTC can provide that service at our Richards Rd. Campus. **You will receive a voucher to have this completed after the program start date.**

DOT Physical and Drug Screen: You will need to successfully complete a DOT (Department of Transportation) physical and drug screen. **After the program start date**, the Admissions Coordinator will schedule your appointment with Genesis Health Plex, located at 2800 Maple Avenue in Zanesville. You will be given a letter with your name and appointment time to present to Genesis as authorization to have your DOT physical and drug screen completed. Results will be sent to Mid-East Career & Technology Centers. Only students who test negative on the drug screen will be permitted to proceed with the class.

CDL: Mid-East Adult Education will assist you in preparing for the written CDL Permit Exam during your class. You will be responsible for obtaining and paying for the CDL Permit (\$27) and the CDL License fee (\$42) at your local DMV.
