Successful completion of the program will enable persons to provide basic, direct and/or indirect patient care and perform various procedures (including venipuncture, EKGs, sterile procedures and related services) necessary to the care and needs of patients/customers, including clerical duties and other department functions as directed.

Enrollment Requirements

Students wishing to enroll in the Multi-Skilled Technician program at the Mid-East CTC, Adult Education must complete the following enrollment procedures in order to be considered for acceptance into this class:

Application: Students must complete a written Application for Admissions and return it to the Adult Education Office during your interview with the Admissions Coordinator. You may set an appointment with the Admissions Coordinator by calling 740-455-3111 or 1-800-832-7545.

General Assessment: A basic assessment is required to be completed by all students entering a Full-time program. This will be scheduled through the Admissions Office during the interview process.

Proof of Graduation: A copy of the student's GED Certificate or high school grade transcripts must be submitted to the Admissions Office.

Interview: Scheduled with instructor after completion of General Assessment.
