Program Level - Undergraduate certificate • Program Length - 40 weeks

Mid-East CTC - Adult Education, in partnership with American Electric Power, now offers Class D Power Lineman training. This is a 900-hour course designed to prepare students for the lineman profession. During this course of study, students participating in the program will receive Class A Commercial Driver's License truck driver training and will also have the opportunity to showcase their skills to potential employers during a skills demonstration week.

STUDENTS:

- Must have a high school diploma (transcript) or GED
- Complete basic assessment
- Complete a physical pre-assessment scheduled at Orientation

- OSHA 30-Hour
- First Aid/CPR
- Climb and set poles
- Operate bucket and digger derricks
- String primary and secondary wire as well as service drops
- Hang cross arms
- Perform hurt man rescue from the pole and the bucket truck
- Understand basic electricity
- Understand transformer theory
- Perform the functions of a ground worker
- Recognize tools and their functions

Enrollment Requirements

Students wishing to enroll in the Power Lineman program at Mid-East Career & Technology Centers must complete the following enrollment procedures in order to be considered for acceptance into this class:

Application: Students must complete a written Application for Admissions and return it to the Adult Education Office during your interview with the Admissions Coordinator. You may set an appointment with the Admissions Coordinator by calling 740-455-3111 or 1-800-832-7545.

Field Assessment: Prospective enrollees must complete a field assessment administered by the Power Lineman course instructors. Students will be scheduled through the Admissions office or at orientation. Orientation will be held on March 17, 2018 at Mid-East CTC Adult Education at 9:00 a.m.

General Assessment: A basic assessment measuring academic areas must be completed. You will be given a schedule of available times to take this assessment.

Financial Aid: Arrangements to have the cost of tuition, books, and supplies paid in full, must be completed to the satisfaction of the Financial Aid Coordinator. Students may apply for Federal Financial Aid in the form of a Pell Grant by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.gov.

Proof of Graduation: A copy of the student's GED Certificate or high school grade transcripts must be submitted to the Admissions Office.

Background Check: You will need to have a BCI Background check (Bureau of Criminal Identification & Investigation) completed. Mid-East CTC will provide that service at our Richards Rd. Campus. **You will receive a voucher to have this completed after the program start date.**

DOT Physical and Drug Screen: You will need to successfully complete a DOT (Department of Transportation) physical and drug screen. **After the program start date**, the Admissions Coordinator will schedule your appointment with Genesis Health Plex, located at 2800 Maple Avenue in Zanesville. You will be given a letter with your name and appointment time to present to Genesis as authorization to have your DOT physical and drug screen completed. Results will be sent to Mid-East Career & Technology Centers. Only students who test negative on the drug screen will be permitted to proceed with the class.

CDL: Mid-East Adult Education will assist you in preparing for the written CDL Permit Exam during your class. You will be responsible for obtaining and paying for the CDL Permit (\$27) and the CDL License fee (\$42) at your local DMV.
