Must pass a pre-entrance exam and personal interview.

Must have a STNA registry or provide a copy of your Certification of Completion of the Ohio approved course of 75 hours or greater.

Enrollment Requirements

Students wishing to enroll in the **Practical Nursing** program at the Mid-East CTC, Adult Education must complete the following enrollment procedures in order to be considered for acceptance into this class:

Adult Education Application: Students must complete an Adult Education Application for Admissions.

Nursing Placement Assessment: The student will be contacted to take a nursing placement examination which is scheduled after the student returns the Adult Education application. There is a \$75.00 Testing Fee for the Nursing Placement Assessment.

Proof of Graduation: A copy of the student's GED Certificate or high school grade transcript must be submitted to the Health Occupations Office with the application.

Interview: Scheduled with Health Occupations Coordinator after completion of Nursing Assessment Exam if scores indicate success on the Exam.

Acceptance Letter: An acceptance letter will be sent you to with further information regarding the requirements that must be completed prior to the start of class. Deadlines will be set and must be followed.
