Enrollment Requirements

Students wishing to enroll in the Welding program at the Mid-East CTC, Adult Education must complete the following enrollment procedures in order to be considered for acceptance into this class:

Application: Students must complete a written Application for Admissions and return it to the Adult Education Office during your interview with the Admissions Coordinator. You may set an appointment with the Admissions Coordinator by calling our office at 740-455-3111 or 1-800-832-7545.

General Assessment: A basic assessment is required to be completed by all students entering a Full-time program. This will be scheduled through the Admissions Office during the interview process.

Financial Aid: Arrangements to have the cost of tuition, books, and supplies paid in full, must be completed to the satisfaction of the Financial Aid Coordinator. Students may apply for Federal Financial Aid in the form of a Pell Grant by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.gov.

Proof of Graduation: A copy of the student's GED Certificate or high school grade transcripts must be submitted to the Admissions Office.
