¹CT2 Legislation directs the Ohio Board of Regents to work collaboratively with the Ohio Department of Education, public adult and secondary career technical education, and state-supported institutions or higher education to establish criteria, policies, and procedures to transfer agreed-upon technical courses from one system to another. Adult Center staff can provide current information on the status of CT2 college transfer credits.
